

Pittsburgh schools to start using MAP® Growth™ in grades K–10 this fall

More than 23,000 students in Pittsburgh will be measured several times per year to test for academic growth.

Pittsburgh, PA and Portland, OR—Aug. 29, 2019: Pittsburgh teachers will have a new tool in the classroom that measures what students know and how much they've learned. In late July, the Pittsburgh Board of Education approved MAP® Growth™, an interim assessment solution provided by not-for-profit educational assessment organization, NWEA.

MAP Growth provides a precise measure of a student's academic performance and growth. A computer-adaptive assessment, it adjusts to each student's responses to provide personalized results about what each student knows, can do, and is ready to learn next—whether on, above, or below grade level. The assessment solution will be available to schools starting this school year and it replaces the current District Predictive Assessment and quarterly math, reading and science assessments.

Pittsburgh schools plan to administer the MAP® Growth™ assessment three times per year in Grades 1–10 in reading, math and writing. The assessment will be optional in grades 11 and 12. The district is still determining if Kindergarten students will be tested twice or three times per year. In addition, the district is considering using the MAP® Growth™ science assessment in grades 3–8.
